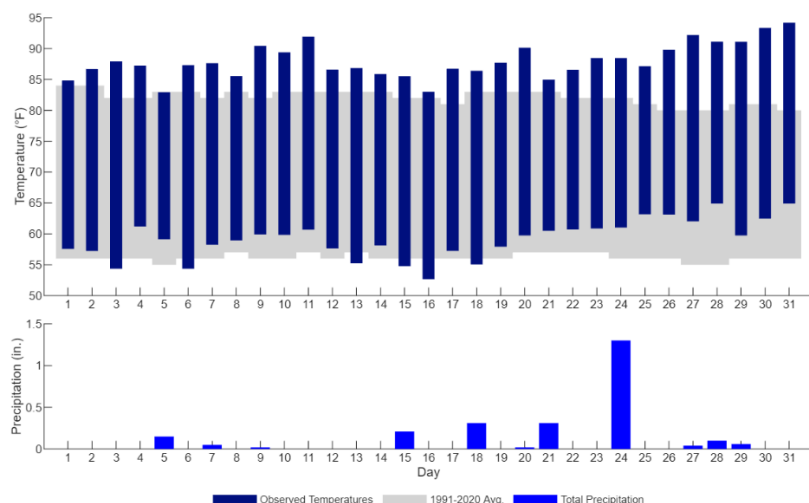

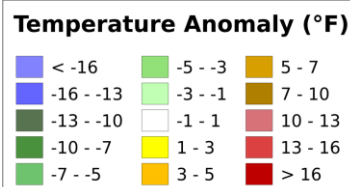
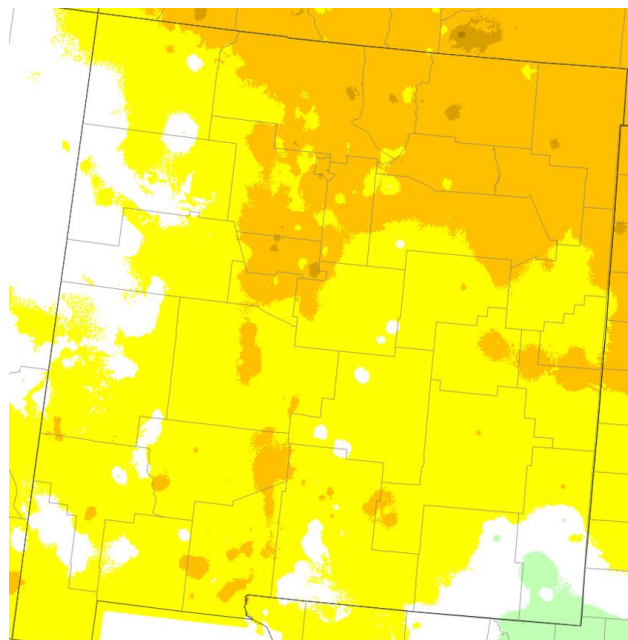

Summary

July was a hot month, with temperatures running well above average. Daily highs were above normal every single day, resulting in a monthly average nearly six degrees above normal. July 31 was 94 degrees, which tied for the fourth-warmest July day on record. As shown below, most of north-central and eastern New Mexico recorded maximum temperatures at least three degrees above normal.

Monsoon moisture began moving into the state in mid-July. Although total precipitation for the month ended up near normal, a brief but intense storm on July 24 delivered heavy rain in a short period. Los Alamos measured 0.92 inches in just 15 minutes, marking the second-highest precipitation amount ever recorded in that timeframe.

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
