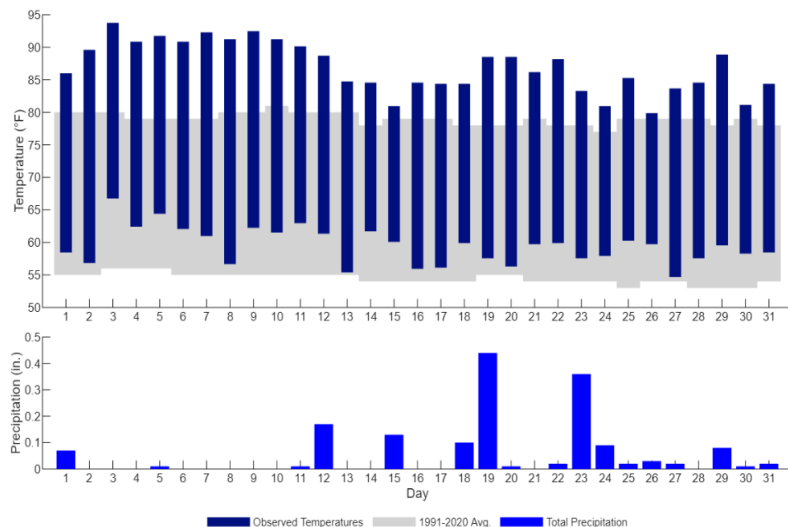


Weather at Los Alamos

August 2026



Temperature & Precipitation



Summary

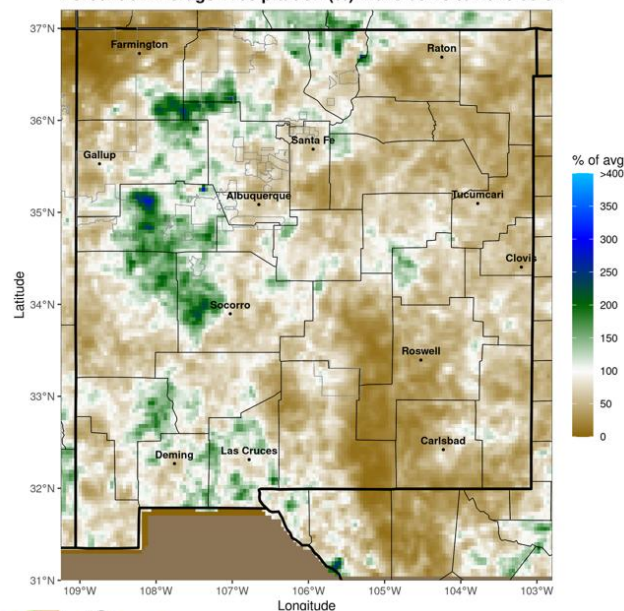
After a sizzling July, August was almost a carbon copy, with an above-average maximum temperature on every single day of the month, without any of the usual cool, wet days. The highest temperature of 94°F on August 3rd matched the hottest day in July.

But while the total precipitation in July was almost average, the 1.59 inches of rain in August was only half of the average for the rainiest month of the year. The result is that the total monsoon precipitation through the end of the month, shown below, has fallen well below average for all of Los Alamos County. Most of New Mexico has also done poorly so far, with only a few wetter areas, such as Cibola County, where impressive storms caused severe flooding in Grants.
